I. Situation Overview

A. Taal Volcano Bulletin

Taal Volcano's activity has been generally characterized by weak emission of steam-laden plumes 500 to 800 meters high from the Main Crater that drifted to the general southwest. A total of two (2) discrete weak ash explosions were observed.

The Philippine Seismic Network (PSN) plotted a total of six hundred seventy-three (673) volcanic earthquakes since 1:00 PM, January 12, 2020. One hundred seventy-five (175) of these were felt with intensities ranging from Intensity I to V. Since 5:00 AM to 12:00 PM today, there were thirteen (13) volcanic earthquakes plotted.

From 5:00 AM to 4:00 PM today, the Taal Volcano Network, which includes small earthquakes undetectable by the PSN, recorded three hundred sixty-six (366) volcanic earthquakes, three (3) tremor events, and eight (8) low-frequency earthquakes. Such intense seismic activity likely signifies continuous magmatic intrusion beneath the Taal edifice, which may lead to further eruptive activity. Latest sulfur dioxide (SO2) emission was measured at an average of 1442 tonnes/day today at 5:00 PM.

Alert Level 4 remains in effect over Taal Volcano. This means that hazardous explosive eruption is possible within hours to days. DOST-PHIVOLCS strongly reiterates total evacuation of Taal Volcano Island and high-risk areas as identified in the hazard maps within the 14-km radius from Taal Main Crater and along the Pansipit River Valley where fissuring has been observed. Residents around Taal Volcano are advised to guard against the effects of heavy and prolonged ashfall. Civil aviation authorities must advise pilots to avoid the airspace around Taal Volcano as airborne ash and ballistic fragments from the eruption column pose hazards to aircraft.

DOST-PHIVOLCS is continually monitoring the eruption and will update all stakeholders of further developments.

 Camp identification and camp management remains to be the primary obstacle in relief services and mobilization. Most evacuation centers are overcrowded, prompting the affected population to consider staying in foster families.

C. Volunteer Management

- Volunteer Response. The emergency response team of LASAC was able to deploy one hundred thirty-six (66) volunteers.
- Areas of improvement. The consolidation of data in order to become efficient must be well coordinated properly with the inhouse technical assistance and donation/funding support.

II. Response

A. Incoming and Outgoing Relief

- In-kind relief has a monetized value of ₱7,822,380.00 while cash donations amounted to ₱3,862,575.90.
- A total number of 33,219 relief service packs were disbursed and shared for over five hundred four (504) evacuation centers all over the province. Further categorized are the following:

- 13,496 food items
- 18,133 non-food items
- 01,590 medicine and supplements

B. Psychosocial intervention, liturgy and prayer

- Eucharistic Adoration is celebrated every hour starting at 7:00 in the morning and culminating at 9:00 in the evening. Various religious organizations spearhead the activity.
- Eucharistic Celebration was celebrated this morning in honor of the patron of the Lipa Archdiocesan Formation Center (LAFORCE) and of the city of Lipa, St. Sebastian.

III. Coordination

- The Lipa Archdiocesan Social Action Commission, Inc. is working closely with the Provincial Government of Batangas, specifically with its social welfare and development office. The affected population are composed of 69,549 families or 297,653 individuals in evacuation. There are already 504 evacuation centers as listed by command center.
- The Most Reverend Archbishop Gilbert Garcera and Rev. Fr. Jayson Siapco had a coordination meeting with the principals, school head and focal persons of various educational institution in the province for the purpose of disseminating situation overview and notifications for volunteer response.
- The Networking and Information cluster had a coordination meeting with the Social Communications Commission of the Archdiocese for synchronization and sharing of information, along with the mainstreaming of situation reports.
- The Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council has requested for medicines and food supplement to augment the supply in evacuation centers. This has been coordinated with the Commission on Healthcare.
